

Two Communities ~ Inextricably Linked ~





Willoughby Slope

- 1. Students attend schools elsewhere in the District
- 2. Build a new 9 12 secondary school
- **3.** Build a new 6 8 middle school





Willoughby Slope Possibility #1

Use existing facilities within the District

Side Effects

- Students bussed or moved to other schools in the District
- Strengthens cohort size at other schools





Willoughby Slope Possibility #2

- **1.** Build a new high school
- **2. REMSS becomes a middle school**











Willoughby Slope Possibility #2

Side Effects

- Requires 42-48 months to complete a new secondary school
- Requires land acquisition
- Requires some seismic upgrades at REMSS
- Requires Ministry funding
- Requires a plan for overcrowding at YCMS





Willoughby Slope Possibility #3

- 1. Build a new middle school
- 2. Expand REMSS
 - Addition built to accommodate 1500 1800 students











Willoughby Slope Possibility #3

Side Effects

- Requires 24–30 months to complete a new middle school
- Requires the consideration of shifts at REMSS during construction
- Requires a plan for students due to overcrowding at YCMS
- Requires Ministry funding
- Requires land acquisition





Potential Short Term Solutions for Yorkson Creek Middle School (Possibilities 2 and 3)

- Schools operate as K-6 schools
- Create a grade 6 school
- Run REMSS as an 8-12 school on shifts
- Bus students to other middle schools
 - Letter sent regarding eligibility requirements for attending YCMS effective September 2016





City Schools

- 1. Complete seismic upgrade at Langley Secondary School
- 2. Close Langley Secondary School
 - HDSMS 9 12
 - Simonds 6 8
- 3. Close Langley Secondary School
 - HDSMS feeds BSS





City Possibility #1

Langley Secondary School remains open

Complete seismic upgrades

Side Effects

- Students and staff remain at current location
- Seismic requirements
 - \$20 million
- Additional costs required on top of the seismic repairs
 - \$18 million
 - » Facility condition costs
 - » No modern enhancements
- School not located in the community
- Does not assist with addressing Willoughby slope needs




City Possibility #2

- **1. Close Langley Secondary School**
- 2. Students attend HDSMS as a secondary school
- 3. Simonds becomes a middle school
 - Simonds students attend another City school(s)













SIMONDS MIDDLE SCHOOL CAPACITY: 600 STUDENTS





City Possibility #2

Side Effects

- LSS and HDSMS students move into remodeled schools in the City and within the neighbourhood
- Students and staff could move together*
- Maintains the LSS culture and community
- Community impacted with move to HDMS
- Impacts on students & staff
- Impacts on Strong Start, daycares, and preschools
- Opportunities for 21st century learning structures
 - Collaborative spaces
 - LEC campus
 - Flexible learning

*requires consultation with, and agreement by, Unions and District



City Possibility #3

Close Langley Secondary School HDSMS feeds into BSS







BROOKSWOOD SECONDARY SCHOOL CAPACITY: 1800 STUDENTS






City Possibility #3

Side Effects

- Langley Secondary students move into an expanded and enhanced Brookswood Secondary School
- LSS community aligns with BSS community
- LSS and BSS culture redefined
- Students could move together
- Two entry points for BSS, grade 8 and grade 9
- Course offerings would be improved due to larger cohorts



Other Considerations

- **1.** Large secondary school at LSS site
- **2.** Other possible locations for a middle school
- **3. Trades Hub at LSS site**
- 4. Close Langley Secondary; students go elsewhere






Langley Education Centre

Need to find a viable location

- Could provide students the option of a 7:30 am -10 pm school*
- May create additional space to offer more opportunities and accommodate growing enrollment
- Not scaling back program (a growing program)

*subject to discussions with District and Unions


