#### Re: Information Bulletin

As we begin Spring Break, I want to express our appreciation and share an update with the community. Thank you again for working together to keep our schools healthy, safe, and open. There has been a tremendous amount of learning in our schools over the past term amidst COVID-19 challenges. Our schools focused their energies on respect, diversity and inclusion as part of Diversity and Respect Week and Black History Month in February. We are proud of the activities that have taken place to help create a positive and welcoming learning environment for all students. We look forward to continuing this work together throughout the year.

### COVID-19 Update

As you may be aware, today (Thursday) the province made an announcement regarding the lifting of COVID-19 restrictions. After Spring Break, mask wearing will no longer be required in K-12 schools, however, individuals may choose to continue wearing masks. In addition, the Ministry of Education has shared updated K-12 health and safety guidelines which will be in effect after Spring Break. These changes can be viewed *here*. As soon as we return to school, our staff will work to implement the most current guidelines.

The removal of the amendments in January have been encouraging, allowing for spectators at sports games and music/theatre productions. We are hearing from staff about how good it feels to have a sense of normalcy and see our students share their talents in front of their peers and families. As we transition, we ask for everyone to be patient, kind, and compassionate with each other. We have all endured this pandemic together over the last two years with grace and understanding.

#### Travel and Testina

Staff, students and families are responsible for understanding and adhering to all international travel requirements including *COVID-19 travel, testing and borders* as outlined by the Government of Canada. Before you travel, please become familiar with travel requirements.

#### Graduation 2022

We recognize our graduates and families are looking forward to celebrations to mark their achievement. We want students to end their education in a memorable and meaningful way and have an uplifting start to their future. The District expects to hold our typical graduation events such as in-person ceremonies, banquets and dances; however, we are waiting for the lifting of the PHO Gatherings and Events Order (expected end of day April 7, 2022). ### Indigenous-Focused Grad Requirement

The Ministry of Education, in collaboration with the First Nations Education Steering Committee (FNESC), has announced that as part of the province's commitments to truth, reconciliation and anti-racism, the Ministry of Education is implementing an Indigenous-focused graduation requirement for all students. The new course will be implemented in a phased approach in 2023-2024. Prior to this change, the Ministry has launched a public consultation to gather feedback. The District supports this new requirement and sees it as a step forward in the District's Truth and Reconciliation journey.

## Student Learning Survey

In an effort to support education for all students, the Ministry is asking families of students in grades 4, 7, 10 and 12 to participate in an online student learning survey about their child's education. We have sent this information to schools. Thank you to families who are taking part. Our District supports any engagement with our community that will help plan for a better future in education for our students.
